

# **Pastor's Letter**

Dear Parishioners,

As I walked down South Street toward Second I noticed a couple approaching me. I could tell that they would pass me but then all of a sudden the gentleman said, "Hello Father." They looked vaguely familiar. Maybe they are parents of someone in the parish I thought to myself. And yes they were. We had met before. They were in from out of town and would be having Thanksgiving dinner with their daughter and son-in-law. "We'll be eating in a few hours," they remarked. It was still almost a week before Thanksgiving Day. But by the way they talked it was the actual day itself. We offered our good byes, they said they looked forward to seeing me at Mass and they proceeded on their way to Thanksgiving Dinner.

As I made my way down Second Street toward Queen I thought about the conversation. If I had not known better I would have thought it was Thanksgiving Day. You could see it in their smiles and hear it in their voices. The twinkle in their eyes just spoke of gratitude for their children and the time they would be spending with them. They were genuinely appreciative of the fact that their daughter would be doing the cooking.

As we celebrate the First Sunday of Advent let our thoughts run to Christmas. We prepare for the joy of that day in these three short weeks (this year) prior to our celebration of what Bishop Robert Barron in the introduction to his book, *Catholicism, A Journey to the Heart of the Faith*, calls the Catholic Thing. The Catholic Thing as he coins it is what makes the Catholic Religion different from so many competing philosophies, ideologies and religions of the world. It, the Catholic Thing, is the Incarnation. It is the enfleshment of God. It is the Word of God who made the Universe as we know it and too, all that we do not know who became a human being like us to show us how to live. Our God did not remain sequestered in heaven but entered into the world, this world of fragile peace and broken promises. God entered into our world that we might know Him, love Him and serve Him, and so be the persons we were created to be.

As I turned up Queen Street I smiled thinking, "We are thankful not only on Thanksgiving Day but every day."

We are reminded too, to celebrate the Incarnation, that is, Christmas, each day, every day. What a gift Jesus is.
