### **Pastor's Letter**

Dear Parishioners,

Hope is a gift that keeps us going. Humans cannot live without hope. Hope makes for a better tomorrow for all people. Hope is a supernatural virtue placed in us at Baptism. Hope is openness to the unimaginable. Advent is the season of Hope.

Brian had been feeling restless for a while. Each day on his way to work he passed his parish church, Saint Patrick. Recently he had felt that he ought to stop in church for a visit. He brushed the feeling aside and continued on his way to work. But the thought would not go away. He kept feeling as if he ought to stop into the church as he passed on his way to work. After about a week the feeling did not go away. He gave in. He went into church. He did not go in because he thought it would help but to prove a point. He thought that if he went in a sat for ten minutes and nothing happened, he could leave and get on with his life.

When Brian sat down he was swallowed up by the silence. He liked how quiet it was. Everything around him was usually so loud. Then he began to daydream about heaven. He wondered how it would be to stand before God. He considered the half-hearted way he was living his life. A deep feeling of dissatisfaction nearly overwhelmed him. Life felt short. He wondered when was the last time he looked into the eyes of his wife and really listened to what she had to say. He thought about the car in the garage he had promised his son they would fix together. He thought about his daughter and how they had done nothing but argue for months. He thought about the last time he had really prayed to God ... really truly prayed. He returned to the parish church the following days. As he sat he began to make a plan with God. #### **PROPERTY TAX REBATE**

To help with the rising cost of living, you are reminded that Pennsylvania Property Tax/Rent Rebate Program applications are now available. There are new guidelines which will permit individuals that qualify to receive a rebate between \$250 and \$650 from property taxes or rent paid last year. Funding for this rebate program is made possible from the Pennsylvania State Lottery Fund and is a rebate that does not have to be repaid. This application must be filed by December 31, 2017.

To qualify, you must be 65 years of age or older, a widow or widower 50 years of age or older, or a disabled person 18 years or older. Homeowners that have annual incomes of \$36,600 or less and renters with annual incomes of \$15,700 or less could qualify. Only half of your annual Social Security or SSI income is counted toward the income guideline. All inquiries are confidential and services are provided free of charge.
