

My dear Parishioners,

In one of his clearest passages about the church being identified as the body of Christ, St. Paul says: "As a body is one though it has many parts, and all the parts of the body, though many, are one body, so also Christ." Later in the passage, he notes, "If (one) part suffers, all the parts suffer with it; if one part is honored, all the parts share its joy." (1 Corinthians 12:12, 26)

A clear example of the truth of St. Paul's insight has afflicted us for years now. The sins of a relatively small percentage of priests against children and teens have rocked the church's faith; cost us enormous amounts of money, destroyed the lives of some innocent priests, made all priests more cautious around young people, and led many to walk away from the church. When one part suffers, the whole body suffers.

Today's readings will inevitably call to mind the pain of these scandals. In the first reading, the prophet Jeremiah proclaims woe to the shepherds who have misled and scattered the flock. Though he was speaking of kings rather than priests, today's hearers will no doubt think of priests as their shepherds. The Gospel speaks of people like sheep without a shepherd, which may remind us of the parishes that do not have a resident priest.

These readings along with the psalm for today remind us that God is our true shepherd, one on whom we can rely completely.

The prayers of today's Mass offer another perspective. The prayer over the offerings prays that what each has offered "may benefit the salvation of all." That reminds us that our good efforts, as well as our sins, affect the rest of the body. What each of us does to reform and renew our church will help to heal the body of Christ. The prayer after Communion prays that we will pass from former ways to newness of life, a clear reference to the continual conversion we need to embrace as a community of faith.

Today we remember in prayer all those who have been abused, for God's forgiveness for abusers and for the healing of the church.
