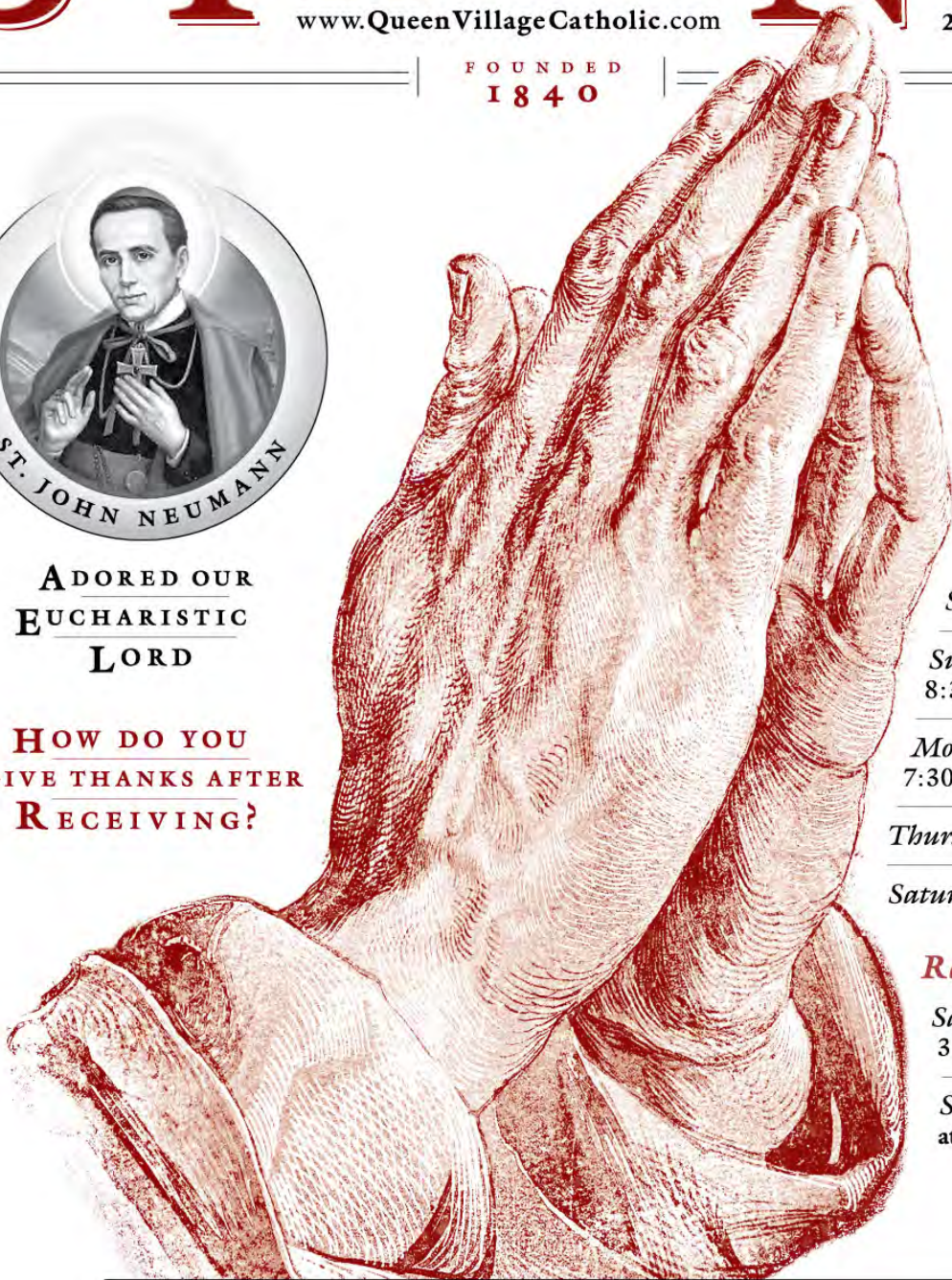

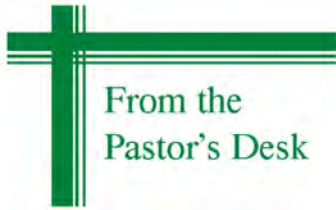

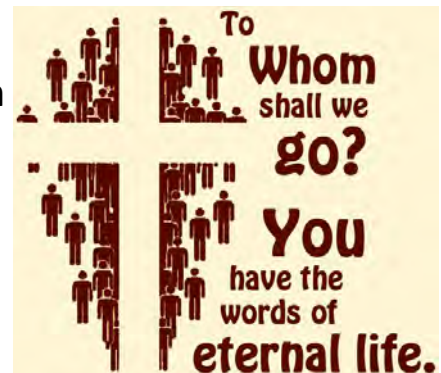
From the

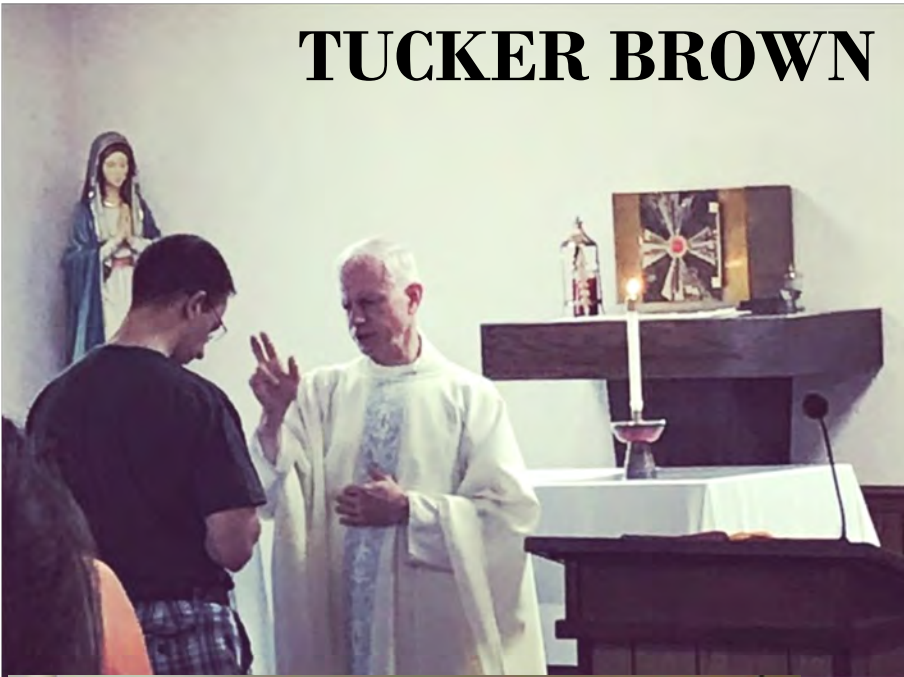
In the first reading, Joshua calls on all the people to "decide today" whom they will serve and says, "As for me and my household, we will serve the Lord."
