My dear Parishioners,

Today's second reading from Hebrews is the first of seven selections we will be hearing from St. Paul. This is a letter that originated as a homily intended to reinspire Christians whose faith was losing its fervor. The entire first chapter is devoted to describing Christ as the most important word God has spoken to humanity. With manifold allusions to the Old Testament, the author uses traditional language to remind the people of Christ's greatness.

In today's selection, the author admits that Jesus was, for a time, less than the angels, and immediately explains why that was so. Jesus chooses inferiority to the angels precisely so that he could be on with humanity in all things, including

death. Adding an exceptional development to the teaching of genesis, Hebrews asserts that in the person of Jesus, God became one with humanity to consecrate us, to be brother and helper to us.

When Jesus sees a criminal on death row, or a homeless woman crawling into a cardboard box for shelter on a cold night, or a person robbed of their

dignity through mental illness; when Jesus sees a woman mourning the death of her child or a man ravaged by cancer or a child slowly starving to death, he does not see a sad statistic or a faceless victim. He sees a brother and a sister whom he loves.

The daily challenge for believers who are brothers and sisters is to take these words to heart.


