


COMING IN JANUARY:

My dear Parishioners,

Today we celebrate the Feast of the Most Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph. They are certainly not an ordinary family. Jesus is the Son of God as well as of Mary. Joseph is his foster father. Mary was "full of grace" - sinless. While married to Joseph, our tradition tells us that Mary remained a virgin.

None of our families can be exactly like the Holy Family in many ways. We can look at the similarities between their struggles and ours.

The Good News today is that we already belong to the holiest of families—God's family. The second reading tells us that we are God's children now! The original Holy Family is the Trinity: Father, Son and Holy Spirit—a love relationship from and for all eternity. Right now, in this church, we are a church family, united by the Holy Spirit, sharing the one Christ makes us holy—that makes us family.
