My dear Parishioners,

"I'll scratch your back; you scratch mine"...

"One hand washes the other" ... familiar sayings such as these convey the fact that many of the relationships we have as human beings are based on the principle of reciprocity. Throughout Jewish history and up until the time of Jesus' ministry, the same principle had governed most

personal interaction. Ancient law codes regulated the retaliation exacted for wrongdoing by demanding "an eye for an eye." This regulation was included in the Hebrew Scriptures (Exodus 21:23-25, Leviticus 24:19-20, Deuteronomy 19:21).

Love your enemies,
do good to those who
hate you,
bless those who
curse you,
pray for those that
mistreat you.

Luke 6:27-38

But as Charles H. Talbert* has explained, Jesus in today's gospel launched a "two-pronged attack on reciprocity as a governing principle in human relationships". On the one hand, those who hear Jesus should not return evil for evil but nonviolence in return for violence. On the other hand, believers must not reserve their good deeds to those who have shown them goodness or to those who can and will return the favor. Rather, those who hear Jesus are to love as they have been loved by God, to give as they have received from him.
