There are a few spots available in Grades K through 7 for the 2019-20 school year. Tuition assistance is available; please contact the school office for more information. Please check our school website (www.ourladyofhopephilly.com) or call the school office for admission requirements.

School Uniforms can be purchased at Boystown/Girlstown on East Passyunk Avenue. Uniform Exchange Program will be open on August 21 in our school auditorium.

Orientation Meeting for parents in Grades Pre K through First Grade will be held on Wednesday, August 21 at 6:30. Parents will meet the teachers and be provided with information and directives regarding arrival, dismissal, and class schedules.

Classes for the 2018-19 School year begin on Wednesday, September 4 for Grades K through 8. Children are to report to the school yard by 7:50 in full uniform. Dismissal for the first three days of school (September 4,5, and 6 will be 1:00.) Bus service is available that day. Student should bring summer packets and supplies with them on the first day of school Full day classes begin on Monday, September 9 and After CARE will begin that day as well.



My dear Parishioners,

Father Oliver left the United States on Tuesday to continue his vacation in England. Behind the scene, Father was a big help, most mornings he



celebrated the morning Mass. I usually celebrate Mass at the St. Monica Center at 10:50 each day, so with him helping out, I have some extra morning time to pray and organize my day.

If Father Oliver were preaching today, he would certainly echo Saint Paul in his letter to the Hebrews: "persevere in running the *race* that lies before us." We are told today so simply and so directly, to "keep our eyes fixed on Jesus, the leader and perfecter of faith."

As our leader, Jesus has gone before us, setting the pace as well as the course by his passion and death on the cross. Because of his endurance and fidelity, he now sits in glory at God's right hand. Through Baptism, believers now run the same course as Jesus and share in his victory forever.

In the final verse of this text, readers are reminded that just as Jesus faced opposition for his efforts, so will they. In fact, the intended first-century recipients of this letter were already facing persecution from Roman as well as Jewish circles. St. Paul continues: "you have not yet resisted to the point of shedding blood."

Today, we are reminded of the cost of Christian faith. Our salvation cost the life of the Son of God. A heritage like that is not something a person can hand down tarnished. The demand for every Christian is: Show yourselves worthy of the sacrifice that has been made for you by Jesus and all the many martyrs who lived and died for him.

Over the next weeks, St. Paul will continue to stress the importance of faith and discipline in the life of the believer. Whoever said it would be easy?
