St. Monica (332-387)

A Christian in North Africa, she married and bore three children. Through her example, her husband, Patricius, became a Christian, and she prayed for the

conversion of her son Augustine, who had abandoned his Christian faith for Manichaeism. When Augustine went to Italy, Monica met him in Milan, where he had met Bishop Ambrose and been baptized. She died during their return trip to Africa, saying all her hopes had been fulfilled.

My dear Parishioners,

In the Gospel for today, Jesus is asked a question that has been asked through the centuries: "will only a few people be saved?" But Jesus will not play the numbers



game. Instead, he speaks directly to those who question him: "Strive to enter through the narrow gate." It is not enough to know who Jesus is, nor even to eat and drink with him. It is not enough to be among the Chosen People, the descendants of "Abraham, Isaac and Jacob." Only those who pass by the narrow gate will have a place in the Kingdom. But many find the way, for at the end of the reading, Jesus speaks of how many people from every place will join the prophets and the righteous at the banquet table of God. And what is the narrow gate? The verse before the Gospel provides the answer: "I am the way, the truth and the life, says the Lord; no one comes to the Father, except through me."

Let us take a moment this week to stop and enjoy these last days of August.
