Our Lady of Hope Regional Catholic School Summer Hours: Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday 8:00—1:30

Tours of the School are available by calling the main office at 215-467-5385 to arrange an appointment.

There are a few spots available in Grades K through 7 for the 2019-20 school year. Tuition assistance is available; please contact the school office for more information. Please check our school website (www.ourladyofhopephilly.com) or call the school office for admission requirements.

School Uniforms can be purchased at Boystown/Girlstown on East Passyunk Avenue. Uniform Exchange Program will be open on August 21 in our school auditorium.

Orientation Meeting for parents in Grades Pre K through First Grade will be held on Wednesday, August 21 at 6:30. Parents will meet the teachers and be provided with information and directives regarding arrival, dismissal, and class schedules.

Classes for the 2018-19 School year begin on Tuesday, September 4 for Grades K through 8. Children are to report to the school yard by 7:50 in full uniform. Dismissal for the first three days of school (September 4,5, and 6 will be 1:00.) Bus service is available that day. Student should bring summer packets and supplies with them on the first day of school Full day classes begin on Monday, September 9 and After CARE will begin that day as well.

Get Acquainted Day for Pre-Kindergarten will take place on Friday, September 6 from 9—11. There will be a meet and greet for parents of Pre Kindergarten and Kindergarten in the school library while the children are in their classrooms. Classes for Pre-K begin on Monday, September 9.
