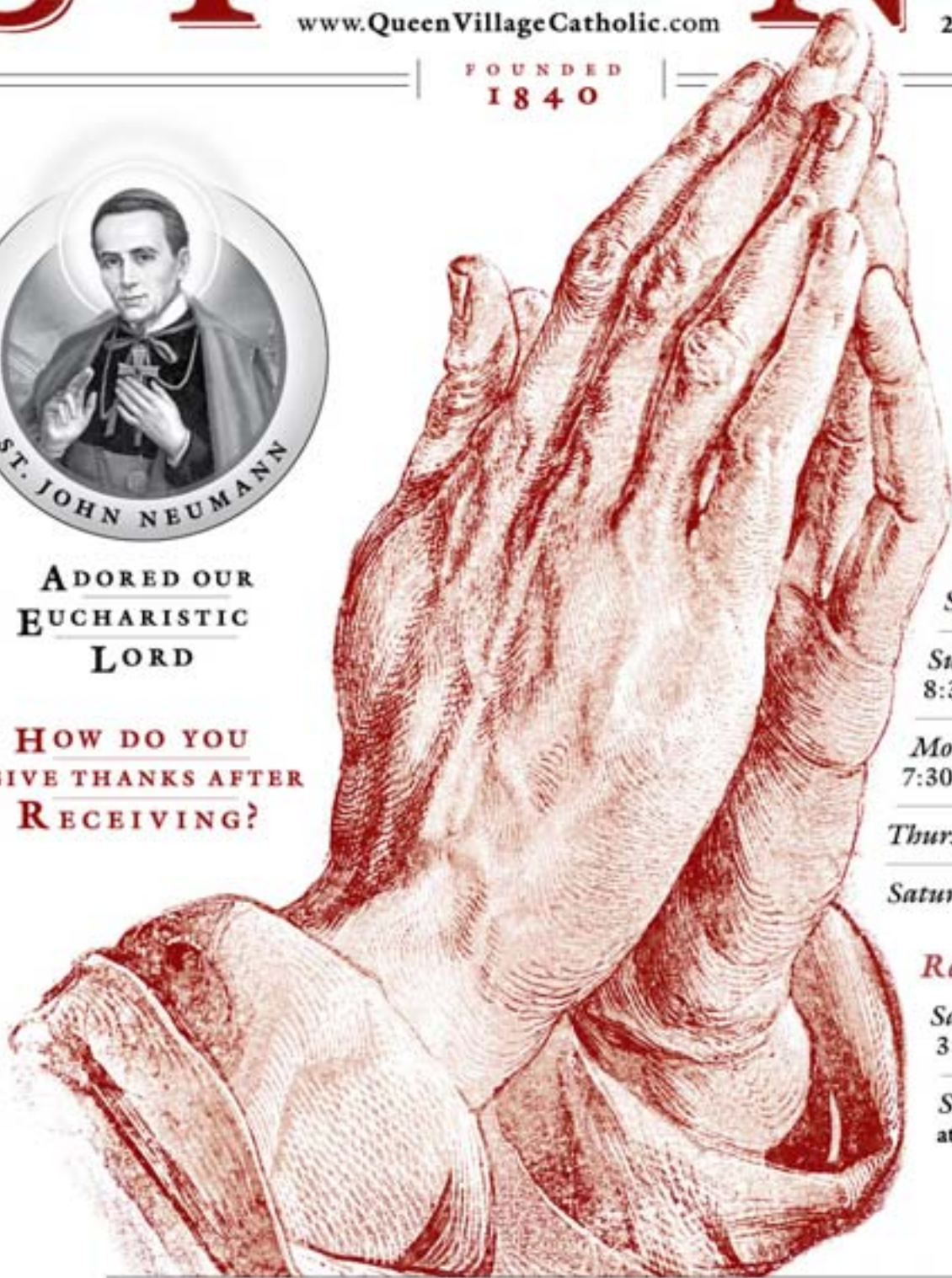

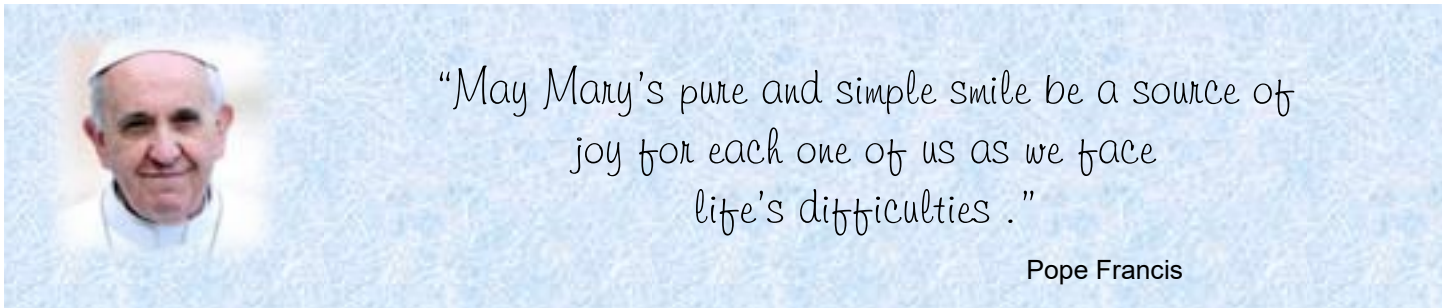

My dear Parishioners,

How can we live the call to discipleship? How can we reconcile the demands of the Gospel with the demands of our lives, our work, and our families? Saint Francis de Sales pondered the same question in his classic work, *The Introduction to the Devout Life*. “The practice of devotion must be adapted to the strength, to the occupation, and to duties of each one in particular. Tell me please. . . whether it is proper for a bishop to want to lead a solitary life like a Carthusian; or for married people to be no more concerned than a Capuchin about increasing their income; or for a working man to spend his whole day in church like a religious. . .?”

Each of us needs to discern our call to discipleship and to ponder how to live the Gospel to the full, not in spite of, but through, the responsibility of our lives.

One sacrifice to which every disciple is called is the sacrifice of prayer. Christians of every time and nation follow the example of Jesus and intercede for others. Let us pray today for those who have sacrificed much and those who are most in need.
