My dear Parishioners,

Forgiveness is the word we hear this Sunday. Jesus assured his own that nothing is too grievous for God to forgive. Throughout salvation history, God forgave sinners—even for infractions like idolatry,




as seen in the first reading from the book of Exodus. In the Gospel and the triple parables of the lost sheep, the lost coin and the lost son, St. Luke has Jesus emphasize the great joy that comes with authentic forgiveness. This joy arises not only in the one who is forgiven, but also in the one who offers forgiveness. Moreover, the parable describes three celebrations at which friends, neighbors and even the angels in heaven rejoice that the lost have been found and that one who was dead has come to life.

Jesus' words challenge our willingness not only to ask for forgiveness, but also to forgive, freely and fully, as God does. Our forgiveness becomes more authentic if it is accompanied by voluntary "amnesia" that refuses to dredge up the past mistakes of another. "I'll forgive but I'll never forget" contradicts the Gospel. Surely such words are better surrendered to the forgotten past.
