

My dear Parishioners,

Two boys found a purse in a parking lot. It probably belonged to the elderly lady who had just driven out of the lot. The purse contained the lady's name, her address and a \$10 bill. One of the boys said, "It's not



right to keep the pruse and the money. But, before we return it, let's change the \$10 into 10 ones." These shrewd "operators" were obviously looking out for themselves and in hopes of a reward for returning the purse, they devised a rather devious plan whereby his future would be secured. For his efforts, his employer praised him as being enterprising. Jesus held him out as an example to his disciples, not because he has Initially dissipated his employer's property but because of the astute manner in which he has dealt with the crisis of being fired. By reducing the amount his master's debtors owed, he was doing nothing dishonest; rather he was simply foregoing his own commission on each transaction, hoping that the debtors would remember him when he had been dismissed from his job.

In the series of sayings attached to today's parable, Jesus offers his disciples further instructions regarding the moral challenge inherent in material possessions. St. Luke's gospel teaching is that possessions are gifts, on loan from God, that are meant to be shared with others, particularly the needy. Pope Francis continues to emphasize that our church is to be poor and we are to reach out to those who are in need.

May we use our wealth to become generous. We cannot live a split life. We are either with Jesus or we are not.
