CHRIST THE KING

My dear Parishioners,

As we in the United States, a democratic nation, celebrate today's Feast, it is good for us to think about what image we have of Christ, our King.

Our image of people is based upon our personal experiences of that person or of that group of persons. Take fathers, for example, Some people think of fathers as kind and loving, concerned for their well being. Others think of fathers as stern and disciplinary, concerned for the order of the household.

We could apply this to the image people have of priests or policemen or any other group of human beings. Our experience of one policeman as being kind will open us to see all policemen as kind and helpful. Our experience of one priest as harsh and boring will affect the way we see all priests.

Indeed, if we are honest and objective with ourselves, we will admit that our perception of another might not be the perception others have. We will also admit that others perceive us in different ways and think of us differently than we think of ourselves. To some, we might be kind and understanding: to other, we may be seen as self-involved and selfish.

These impressions we have of ourselves and others, as individuals or groups, are natural; and it is so difficult to change these impressions or images.

In a democracy, we have no personal experiences of kings. How, then do we think of Christ, our King?

We know that He came among us and announced His kingdom. Paul reminds us that He is the image of the invisible God; that all things were created through Him and for Him; that He has primacy in all things; and that He made peace through the blood of His cross.

However, this wonderful King did not surround Himself with external trappings of glory and kingship. The Reading from Luke shows our King on a cross, considered a criminal. Those standing around taunted him, jeering him with the words "If you are the King of the Jews, save yourself." This is certainly not a very enhancing view of One who was King.

Our image of Christ the King must be faithful to the Gospels. We must see Him not only as a power within the universe, but also as a loving friend who lived among us. His Kingship is not that of the leaders of this world, but that of a loving God who would do anything, even die, for us.

On this wonderful feast day, let us open our hearts to our King; experience His grace, and come to see Him as He truly is: a loving King whose kingdom is one of peace, love, truth and justice.
