Today we celebrate the Feast of the Presentation, exactly 40 days after Christmas. Today is the day when the presentation would have occurred according to Jewish Law. At one time, this feast marked the end of the Christmas season. Today's Gospel notes that it occurred "when the days were completed for their purification according to the law of Moses."

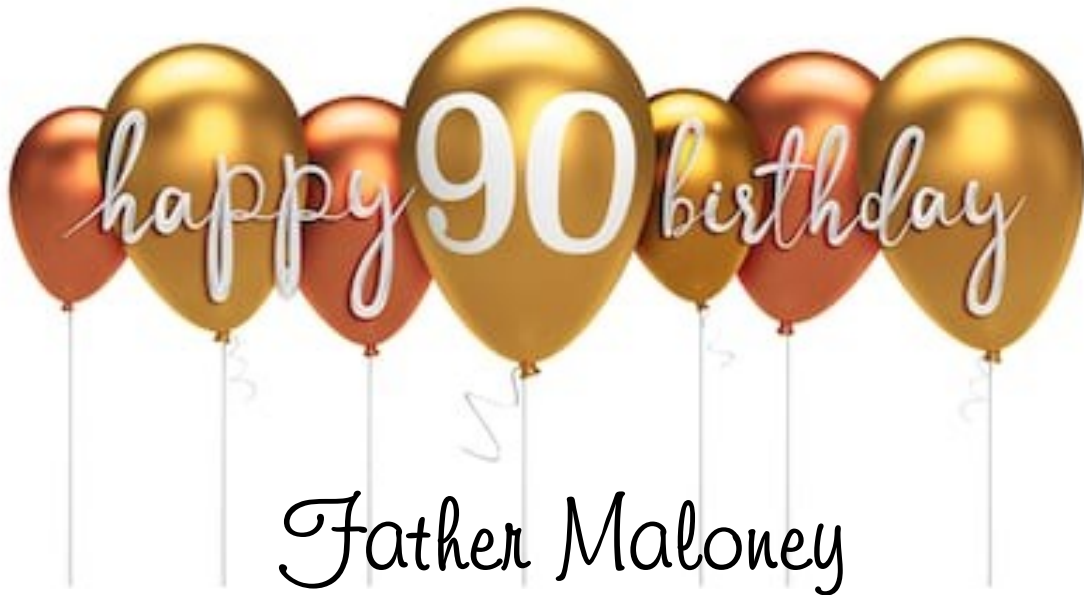
Leviticus 12:1-4 indicates that, for a male child, this would be 40 days after his birth.

The themes of the feast reflect this Christmas connection. It commemorates an event described in the infancy narrative. It is a manifestation of the Messiah, especially to Simeon and Anna. And light is the dominant theme, presenting Jesus as a "light for revelation to the Gentiles, and glory for your people Israel."

My friends, before you put away your warm memories of Christmas,  we have another party planned! Father Maloney's ninetieth anniversary of birth is coming up, so mark your calendars for CAM (community after Mass) on Sunday, February 9 after the 11:00. Then, I promise we will get serious about Lent—the season of self-denial.
