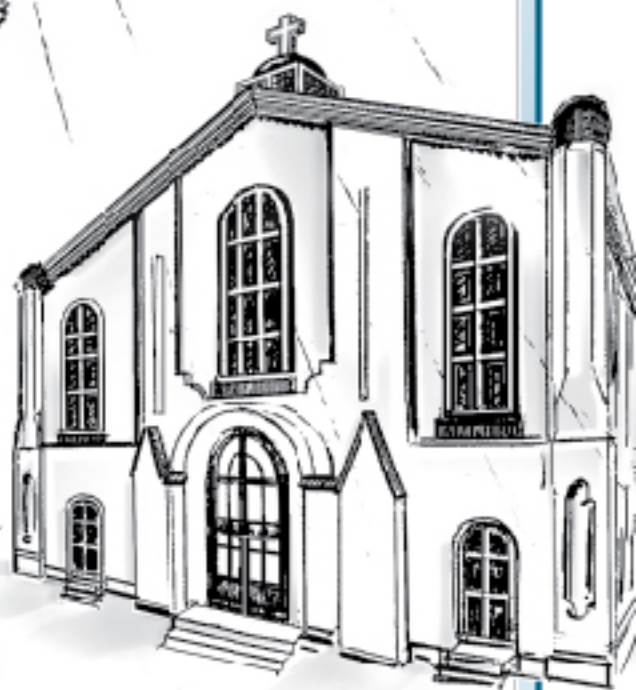

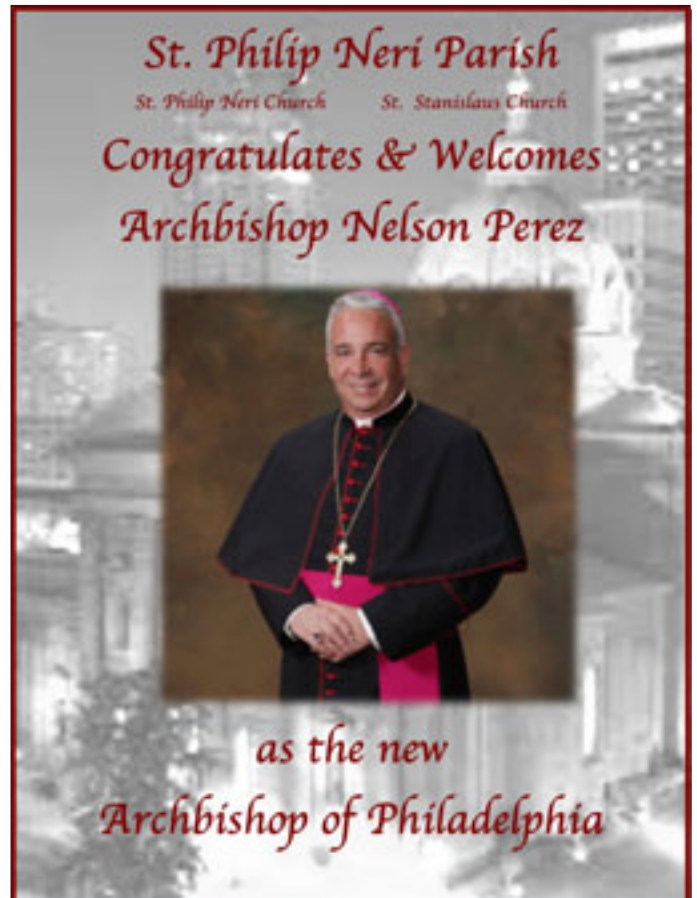

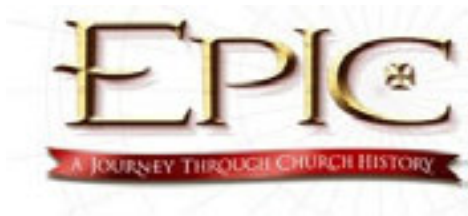
My Dear Parishioners,
