FOCUS was started at a small college in Kansas called Benedictine College in 1998 by Curtis Martin. The whole mission of FOCUS is to go to college campuses and spread the gospel to college students. About 85% of Catholics who do enter college leave the faith before the end of their four years. Just reading that makes people realize why we need the faith spread on the campuses!

I will be serving at Bridgewater State University in Bridgewater, Massachusetts! I am on a team with three other missionaries and we will be walking with the students and showing them what it is like to have God a part of their lives! We will run bible studies, leadership groups, mission trips, and serving the poor in the Massachusetts area. We will be taking part in the student's lives by getting lunch with them going to sporting events or even playing sports with them.



I feel called to this because when I was a freshman in college I was lost. I went to Temple University (just graduated!!!) and was in the dorms, on the club hockey team, and trying to find my group. It wasn't until I went to the Newman Center at Temple where I found my group and ultimately, started taking my faith seriously. God wants me to reach out to those students who were in my position in my freshman year. The ones who are lost.

My dear Parishioners,

A pastor of a large congregation in upstate New York shared this experience with his Parishioners:

“Three minutes had elapsed since I sat down at the lunch counter. Waitresses passed me by; two short-order cooks and a bus-boy paid me no mind. My ego was somewhat soothed because a truck driver seated next to me was also being ignored. ‘Maybe this counter is off-limits.’ I said to him. ‘Maybe they are short of help,’ he responded. ‘Maybe they don’t want our business,’ I complained. ‘Maybe they are taking care of those at tables,’ he reasoned. ‘Maybe they don’t like us!’ I insisted. ‘This air conditioning is so pleasant I don’t mind the wait,’ he said.”

“At that moment, a frazzled waitress stopped to tell us that the water had been cut off and the dishwasher wasn’t working. My counter mate smiled and thanked the waitress and left. I didn’t like him. Three times, I had sought his support for my obnoxious attitude, but he had let me down. Only later did I finally realize that he has chosen to practice what I preach.”

Today we hear another parable of the kingdom. In this parable of the wheat and the weeds, Jesus tells us that we must be patient as God is patient, and leave to God the condemnation of the “weeds” - that is, those who do evil. Our job is to avoid evil, acknowledge our failings and thereby to grow straight and strong like the wheat.

May God grant us the grace, this week, that we may live as true disciples of his Son, Our Lord Jesus Christ.
