



My dear Parishioners,

Today's Gospel parable offers a practical situation. A father makes this request to his two sons: He wants them both to go into the family vineyard and work. The first said no, but later decides to go. The second said yes and never went. Then Christ asked, "Which of the two did his father's will?" Of course, it's the one who changed his mind and went.

The parable tells the story of most Christians. For many different reasons, they resist the graces God sends and go off to do their own thing. If they do go and carry out God's request, it is because love or gratitude has moved them. Life's moments provide twists and turns and distractions, which mar decisions.

Often, choices are made because it is the right thing to do. Some Christians often believe it is what Christ would desire and, prompted by the Holy Spirit, their free will chooses it. A bigger group are those who change their mind after first refusing. It is as if they experience a minor conversion needed to reflect more before acting.

These ongoing conversions happen periodically as the journey moves forward with challenging situations. Robert Front talks about them in "The Road Not Taken." In the poem, the traveler faces a simple choice: to decide which of the two roads he faces takes him where he wants to go. He weighs his options, then decided. Later in life, he reviews his choice.

I shall be telling this with a sigh./
Somewhere ages and ages hence:/
Two roads diverged in a wood and I -/
I took the one less traveled by./
And that has made all the difference.


Many decisions, big and small, may or may not seem important at the time. Yet when they do, we can say, "And that has made all the difference." The difference can be simple or imposing.

For example, St. Paul converts to Jesus and becomes the Apostle to the Gentiles; Joseph decides to take Mary as his wife and becomes the protector of the Mother of God and Jesus, the Word made flesh. These choices were daunting, and they have made all the difference.

For the greater majority whose lives lack drama, Paul's hymn in Philippians gives solace to all: "Have in you the same attitude that is also in Christ Jesus, / Who, though he was in the form of God, / did not regard equality with God something to be grasped. / Rather, he emptied himself, / taking on the form of a slave / coming in human likeness / and found human in appearance / he humbled himself, becoming obedient to the point of death, even death on a cross.
