



My dear Parishioners,

This morning's gospel seems to be about stupidity. A couple cases of it, actually. First, we have the tenant farmers. The property owner puts them in charge of his brand new, classy, state-of-the-art vineyard. Right from the start, it has hedge around it, a brand new vat, a tower. All the tenant farmers have to do is take care of it, which we can assume they know how to do, and at the end of the season, the owner gets his cut and they get the rest. It's a really sweet deal. And what do they do? They royally blow it! They beat, kill, and stone the slaves, who are coming only to get the master's rightful share, and finally they kill the master's son! This is stupidity gone off the deep end.

They should have let them have their cut. You may be thinking, "Look, I have never, absolutely never, beaten, stoned or otherwise killed a rich property owner's slave! On top of that, I'm not even a tenant farmer, and the only thing I know about grapes is that they're in Welch's jelly.


And I'm sure that's all true. But we'd be stupid if we didn't face the fact that sometimes we really are—this is not going to feel good—somewhat like the stupid tenant farmers. They had a good deal, they had everything they need, but they wanted it all, including what didn't belong to them, what was off limits to them. They wanted it both ways—what they were supposed to have and what they were not supposed to have.

God gives us a good deal, too—the best. But sometimes we want it both ways. We want God and we want...other stuff. More than our share. Sometimes that other stuff is positively, provably wrong, and sometimes it's kind of like not tending the grapes. We waste time, we waste our talents on things that just aren't going to matter. All of us are the tenant farmers at times.

I mentioned there were two cases of stupidity in this gospel. The second case is the property owner's. He puts the tenant farmers, wh haven't exactly proven themselves, in charge of something major and trusts them to get the job done. And it's obvious the property owner stands for God. So...is God stupid? Stupid for trusting us, for leaving us free? And for continuing to let us work in the vineyard of our lives even when we screw up? Maybe that's the "sort of" stupidity that's also known as infinite love. A good prayer today would be, "Dear God, thanks for being, well, stupid in *Your* divine way, and please help *me* not to be stupid in my way."
