

My dear Parishioners,

All Saints Day does more than honor those whom we know as saints. It offers hope and consolation to all who doubt their potential for goodness. It reminds us that not every saint was an unbathed old man living in a desert cave or an innocent young girl martyred in horrifying fashion for her virtue. Today is the feast of our parents, perhaps our spouses, or some of our best friends. It is the feast of those who believe in our God or in other gods, who struggled and sometimes failed, who were kings and peasants, hawks and doves, black and white, Catholic, Protestants, Jews, Moslems and pagans.

One of our problems with saints is that we have thought of them as perfect, and therefore have thought of sainthood as unattainable. The opposite is true: *no* saint is perfect, and sanctity *is* attainable. The healthiest and holiest of the saints were those who knew their limitations and imperfections, but who went beyond them and found salvation through them. Thomas who doubted Peter who denied, Magdalen who prostituted, Jerome who rages, Augustine who lusted, Matthew who hoarded and Paul who oppressed—all went beyond their sins.

The sins of the saints show us that sanctity, like so much else in life, is a matter of growth. *Everyone* has a personal history, and what we honor in the saints is but their final chapter, what they chose to *become* with the gifts and the frailties that were theirs. The *process* is as important as the outcome. The steps cannot be skipped. The sins of the saints, though not to be condoned, were often factors in conversion and commitment. Presumably, Thomas stopped his doubting, Peter his lying, Augustine his lusting, But perhaps they failed and failed again. Their sainthood was attained in the company of some failures.

Neither is All Saints Day a time for comparisons to others, especially to so-called "holy people." We are all blessed with uniqueness and special gifts poured out by the Spirit, and each of us enjoys spheres in which we are greater than Aquinas, greater than Paul. Today is a day to celebrate the marvelous diversity of the church's nature.

Above all, All Saints Day is a reminder that we become what we choose to be. We are all invited to sainthood, but we still must pursue it. Each Beatitude involves a choice: Blessed are they who choose simplicity in the midst of plenty, who choose peace in warring world, gentleness in an aggressive culture, mercy in an uncaring time, purity in a depraved age, justice in an unjust land, detachment in a consumer society. We cannot control all that happens, but we can control how we respond.


A principal way to holiness and wholeness is by recognizing a need, and responding to it. Often, this means responding to a person. Yes, it is harder to love our neighbor that to love God, whom we don't see. But for us not called to the life of a hermit, sanctity comes by being with other people, not by escaping them.

Saints have happy faces. They bring people together. They move through our world with gentleness and kindness and love. They are very much a part of the world, embracing it and redeeming it with the gift they make of themselves in the service of others. Each of us is capable of doing at least some of these things.
