My dear Parishioners,

To separate the honorable from the dishonorable and to shepherd each to their appropriate places, Jesus examines how people responded to the dispossessed during their lives. The ones judged to be honorable and those judged to be dis-



honorable give the same response: "Lord, when did we see you hungry and feed you, or thirsty and give you drink...?" The honorable did the right thing not because they saw Jesus; they admit as much. They simply saw and responded to people in need.

Our tendency to blame poverty on the poor makes it hard to take this passage seriously. If they really wanted healthcare, education, housing and adequate wages, the thinking goes, they could get it. Jesus is being irresponsible here and so is St. Matthew.

Such thinking may or may not be true to the experience of the poor, or even be good economics, but it does not make for a healthy society. When we profess Christian faith, we profess that the dispossessed - the ones left out of the marketplace, the disposable ones - actually matter. The market may not have a place for their particular skills, but God finds them invaluable.

According to Matthew, the closest we can come to a transformative face-to-face encounter with Jesus is to be fully present to the poor and marginalized.

So, what are we afraid of? Getting dirty, not knowing what to say, not having answers to hard questions, loving ourselves? Losing our faith?

The last judgment is about God shepherding us into the finality of our choices. Outcomes will be true to who we have made ourselves. Plan ahead what to say at the Last Judgment. What books to quote. How to argue. What pundits to reference. If those fail, or draw from God a kind of bewildered stare, try quickly reevaluating modern economic assumptions. It may become clear during this planning session that Gospel insights will save us and that investing in them is worth the risk.

As predicted, the city has reinstated some of the restrictions concerning social gathering. As the percentages were rising in the county we know that this could happen. Archbishop Perez has reminded us that Sunday Mass obligation will not be in effect throughout the Advent/Christmas season. If you are not felling well or have pre-existing health conditions (advanced age), it probably would be smart to absent yourself from attending Mass. I am always available to celebrate the Sacraments of Penance, Holy Communion and Anointing of the Sick in your home.


